

Gallows Hill Project Called Greatest Improvement In Area

Planning for the rebuilding this year of the Gallows Hill Road which will create three small lakes through use of high-way fills as dams was the most spectacular State Government project in this area during 1962, it has been announced in Frankfort.

One of the lakes will serve a 4-H Camp and the others will serve as sources for water supply and recreation. The construction contract was awarded at a cost of \$294,922.

About \$150,000 in capital construction funds has been spent by the State on another lake project in the county, the Nicholas County Dam and Lake. These lakes are part of a statewide chain being developed under the direction of Gov. Bert Combs' Small Lakes Committee to provide recreation facilities, community water supplies, and to aid in flood control.
